# Biographies: Endowed Professors



## **DEEPAK L. BHATT, MD, MPH**

**Dr. Valentin Fuster Professor of Cardiovascular Medicine**

Deepak L. Bhatt, MD, MPH, is Director of Mount Sinai Heart and the Dr. Valentin Fuster Professor of Cardiovascular Medicine at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. Dr. Bhatt is a leading expert in the field of cardiology, including interventional cardiology, heart disease prevention, vascular medicine, and heart failure. Among his many achievements, Dr. Bhatt led a trial that demonstrated the benefit of a potent intravenous antithrombotic drug in reducing clotting during stenting. Other work resulted in the first FDA-approved drug to reduce cardiovascular risk among patients with elevated

triglyceride levels already treated with statins. Dr. Bhatt also led the first trial that showed the significant benefit of any drug in treating patients with heart failure despite having normal heart muscle function—a major milestone in cardiovascular medicine.

Dr. Bhatt has authored or co-authored more than 2,000 publications and was listed as Highly Cited Researcher by Web of Science and from 2014 to 2022. He is Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of Invasive Cardiology*, and editor of *Cardiovascular Intervention: A Companion to Braunwald's Heart Disease*, *Opie's Cardiovascular Drugs: A Companion to Braunwald's Heart Disease*, and a co-editor of *Braunwald's Heart Disease*. In recognition of his many contributions to science and medicine, Dr. Bhatt has received several accolades, including the American College of Cardiology's Distinguished Mentor Award in 2018, the American Heart Association's Distinguished Scientist Award in 2019, the National Lipid Association's Honorary Lifetime Membership Award in 2021, and the Society for Cardiovascular Angiography and Interventions' Master designation in 2022.

Prior to joining Mount Sinai, Dr. Bhatt was a Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School, where he served as Editor-in-Chief of the *Harvard Heart Letter*. He previously served as the Chief of Cardiology at VA Boston Healthcare System and subsequently as Executive Director of Interventional Cardiovascular Programs at Brigham and Women's Hospital. Dr. Bhatt was also Chief Interventional Fellow at the Cleveland Clinic, where he spent many years as an interventional cardiologist, holding numerous clinical, academic, and leadership positions.

After graduating as valedictorian from Boston Latin School, Dr. Bhatt obtained his science degree as a National Merit Scholar at MIT. He received his medical degree from Cornell University, and a master's degree in public health from Harvard. He trained in internal medicine at the University of Pennsylvania and in cardiology at Cleveland Clinic, where he completed fellowships in interventional cardiology and cerebral and peripheral vascular intervention. He is currently earning his Executive MBA from Oxford University.

## **Dr. Valentin Fuster Professor of Cardiovascular Medicine**

The Dr. Valentin Fuster Professor of Cardiovascular Medicine was established in 2018 by The Kapnick Foundation in honor of Dr. Valentin Fuster, President of Mount Sinai Heart, Physician-in-Chief of The Mount Sinai Hospital, and Director of the Zena and Michael A. Wiener Cardiovascular Institute.

Through The Kapnick Foundation, Scott and Kathleen Kapnick have provided their generous support to a number of areas across the Mount Sinai Health System, including cardiovascular medicine, breast cancer research, medical student scholarships, the Division of Infectious Diseases, and a number of important capital improvement projects.

# Biographies: Endowed Professors



**BRIAN D. BROWN, PhD**  
Mount Sinai Professor of Genetic Engineering

Brian D. Brown, PhD, is Director of the Icahn Genomics Institute (IGI), Associate Director of the Marc and Jennifer Lipschultz Precision Immunology Institute (PrISM), Vice Chair of the Department of Immunology and Immunotherapy, and Professor of Genetics and Genomic Sciences, and Dermatology at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. He is also a member of The Tisch Cancer Institute, the Diabetes, Obesity and Metabolism Institute, and The Mindich Child Health and Development Institute.

Dr. Brown's research focuses on understanding the ways different cells and cell states control immunity and tolerance in tissues and tumors, and translating this knowledge into therapeutics for controlling immune responses to treat cancer and autoimmune disease. His work includes the identification of genes that regulate immune cell function in steady-state and tumors and the discovery of a pathway controlling the innate response to nucleic acids, including nucleic acid therapeutics. His studies have uncovered new insights into how T cells interact with stem cells of the gut, skin, breast, ovary, and muscle, and he has identified the roles of specific genes in breast, lung and ovarian cancer immunity.

Dr. Brown has developed a number of novel technologies, including inventing the microRNA (miRNA) target site technology, a platform technology for targeting DNA, RNA, and virus-based drugs, which has been widely used in numerous experimental applications ranging from treatments for genetic disease to cancer therapies. He also invented technologies for functional genomics, including the first genome-wide miRNA vector libraries to study miRNA activity and function at single cell resolution, the largest cell and vector protein barcode (Pro-Code) technology, and Perturb-map, the first tissue-level spatial CRISPR genomics platform. Dr. Brown co-invented RNA adapter technology which is licensed by Perkin Elmer for their popular small RNA sequencing kit, and created a novel T cell technology, the Jedi, which enables interrogation of T cell interactions with virtually any cell type.

Dr. Brown has published in some of the most highest-impact scientific journals, including *Nature* and *Cell*, he lectures all over the world on his research, he is on the editorial board of *Molecular Therapy*, a member of the American Society of Gene and Cell Therapy, and he serves on several scientific advisory boards. He has been honored with two of the National Institutes of Health's most prestigious awards: the New Innovator Award in 2008 and the Director's Transformative Research Award in 2021. Additionally, Dr. Brown has initiated a number of community outreach efforts, including a partnership between PrISM and nearby Park East High School to advance science education for underserved students, and speaking and consulting on the science of science fiction.

Dr. Brown earned his Bachelor's degree in Biomedical Science from the University of Guelph and his PhD in Pathology from Queen's University in Canada. He completed Postdoctoral training in gene and cell therapy at the Telethon Institute for Gene Therapy in Italy. He joined the faculty of Mount Sinai in 2008.

**MICHAL A. ELOVITZ, MD**  
**Mount Sinai Professor of Women's Health Research**

Michal A. Elovitz, MD, is the inaugural Dean of Women's Health Research at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai and founding director of the Women's Biomedical Research Institute at Mount Sinai. Dr. Elovitz is one of the world's leading physician-scientists in obstetrics and gynecology renowned for her studies on reproductive, maternal, and child health, as well as her mentorship of the next generation of leaders in women's health.

A prolific researcher with over 20 years of NIH fundings, she has conducted fundamental and translational research to advance the fields of reproductive science and women's health. Her bench to the bedside research has focused on understanding the mechanisms and consequences of adverse reproductive and pregnancy outcomes, considering the pregnancy as well as the long-term health implications for the mother and child. Her work integrating immunology and microbiology into reproductive health, has led to novel discoveries for maternal-fetal health. Dr. Elovitz's mission is to break down traditional silos and to create partnerships across different disciplines to advance understanding of female- and sex-specific biology and to drive new opportunities to improve the health of women across their lifespan.

Dr. Elovitz currently mentors students, postdoctoral fellows, clinical fellows, and early and mid-career faculty. She is committed to promoting equity in medicine and science and seeks to foster and empower women as physicians and scientists.

Dr. Elovitz is a member of the American College of Obstetrics & Gynecology, the Society of Maternal Fetal Medicine, and the Society of Reproductive Investigation. She is an active member of the NIH peer review process, serving both as an ad hoc reviewer and standing member of two independent study sections. She has been an Associate Editor for two major OB/GYN journals, and is a frequent reviewer of high-impact publications. A graduate of the University of Texas and the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Dr. Elovitz completed her residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at Cornell University and completed a fellowship in Maternal Fetal Medicine at the University of Chicago.

**ANA FERNANDEZ-SESMA, PhD**  
**Mount Sinai Professor of Microbiology and Infectious Diseases**

Ana Fernandez-Sesma, PhD, is Professor and Chair of the Department of Microbiology at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. Her research focuses on the modulation of innate immunity by viruses, such as dengue, influenza, human immunodeficiency virus, Zika, and SARS-CoV-2. Her studies aim to understand the mechanisms of immune evasion used by these viruses to establish infection in humans.

Dr. Fernandez-Sesma currently participates in several multi-investigator projects that use OMICS technologies to study immune responses to infection and vaccination, and has also participated in several study sections for the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the Department of Defense, and the Centers for Disease Control. She was a member of the Scientific Council of the Division of Microbiology and Infectious Diseases at the NIH, and chaired the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases Human Immunology Project Consortium Steering Committee from 2018 to 2022. Dr. Fernandez-Sesma has co-authored numerous publications and sits on the editorial board of *Journal of Virology*, *mSphere*, and *PLoS Pathogens*. She also co-organized the 2023 Gordon Research Conference: Viruses and Cells and delivered the keynote lecture at the 2023 Annual Meeting for the American Society of Virology.

Dr. Fernandez-Sesma is dedicated to graduate education and mentoring, serving as co-director of the Microbiology Main Training Area of the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences at Icahn Mount Sinai from 2010 to 2020. She is an alumna of the Graduate School of Biological Sciences at Icahn Mount Sinai and a recipient of the prestigious Jacobi Medallion. She is also a Fellow of the American Academy of Microbiology and an honorary alumna of the University of Salamanca, Spain.

# Biographies: Endowed Professors



**MARIANA G. FIGUEIRO, PhD**  
**Mount Sinai Professor of Light and Health Research**

Mariana G. Figueiro, PhD, is Professor of Population Health Science and Policy at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai and Director of the Mount Sinai Light and Health Research Center. Dr. Figueiro's research explores the effects of light on circadian entrainment and disruption with a focus on the impact of light on sleep, depression, and agitation in people with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias (ADRD) and mild cognitive impairment (MCI). Her studies also explore the effects of light on shift workers, those who work in dark environments, and adolescents. Dr. Figueiro's work has

demonstrated that improvement in sleep outcomes resulting from a regular, entrained circadian system leads to concomitant improvements in mood, cognition, and quality of life. She has authored or co-authored over 130 articles in peer-reviewed journals, frequently appears as an invited speaker in national and international forums, and in 2014, she delivered an acclaimed TEDMED talk entitled "Why an enlightened design integrates illumination."

Dr. Figueiro is currently a Principal Investigator or Co-Investigator on twelve National Institutes of Health studies (9 R01s, 2 R21s and 1 SBIR) investigating the impact of light on important health outcomes in several populations. These include research exploring the impact of light on sleep, mood, and behavior in older adults living with ADRD; on sleep physiology and cognition in MCI; on metabolic syndrome in ADRD and MCI; and on the use of light as a visual cue to assist in preventing falls in older adult populations. She is also leading research on the use of light to improve outcomes for multiple myeloma patients receiving autologous stem cell transplantation and pioneering health equity research to develop a bias-free pulse oximetry device that will more accurately read oxygen levels in people with dark skin pigmentation. Finally, she is conducting research in preventing circadian disruption for nightshift nurses and studying the impact of circadian disruption on diabetes and atherosclerotic disease.

Dr. Figueiro has served on the editorial boards of *Sleep Health: Journal of the National Sleep Foundation*, *The Journal of Post-Acute and Long-Term Care Medicine*, the *Journal of Alzheimer's Disease*, and *Frontiers in Physiology*. She has been honored with numerous awards, including the James D. Watson Investigator Award from the New York State Foundation for Science, Technology, and Innovation; the Young Investigator Award from the Office of Naval Research; the James M. Tien '66 Early Career Award for Faculty from the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute; and the Walsh-Weston and Leon Gaster Awards from The Society of Light and Lighting. Dr. Figueiro has also been named a fellow of the Illuminating Engineering Society in recognition of her contributions to lighting research.

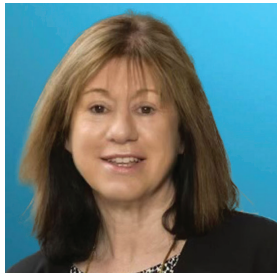

# Biographies: Endowed Professors



**CAROL C. GREGORIO, PhD**  
**Irene and Dr. Arthur M. Fishberg Professor of Medicine**

Carol C. Gregorio, PhD, is Senior Associate Dean for Basic Science, Founding Director of the Center for Cardiac Muscle Biology, Vice Chair for Strategic Innovation, and Professor of Medicine at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai.

Trained as a basic scientist, Dr. Gregorio's research program focuses on deciphering the fundamental cellular mechanisms involved in the development and regulation of contractile proteins in cardiac and skeletal muscle. Her work spans the fields of cell

biology, biophysics, biochemistry, bioengineering, bioinformatics, and genetics.

Prior to joining Mount Sinai in 2023, she was Head of the Department of Cellular and Molecular Medicine at the University of Arizona, where she oversaw significant improvements in the department's national Blue Ridge Institute for Medical Research rankings (from 27th to 5th) and increased research expenditures by almost 100 percent. At the University of Arizona, Dr. Gregorio was also Vice-Dean for Innovation and Development, Founder and Director of the Sarver Molecular Cardiovascular Research Program and Interim Director of the Sarver Heart Center. Dr. Gregorio also served as Assistant Vice Provost for Global Health Sciences, establishing one-of-a-kind undergraduate and graduate educational and research partnerships between the University of Arizona and several institutions around the globe.

Dr. Gregorio is an active member of several editorial and philanthropic boards and is a frequent grant reviewer at the National Institutes of Health. She was awarded "Mentor of the Year" at the University of Arizona, and was inaugurated as a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and as a Fellow of the American Association of Anatomists. She has authored more than 100 peer-reviewed publications and given keynote addresses in the United States, Europe, Asia, and Africa.

She received her bachelor's degree in biological sciences and master's degree in natural sciences from the State University of New York at Buffalo. Subsequently, she earned her doctorate in molecular immunology from Roswell Park Cancer Institute in Buffalo, New York, and completed her postdoctoral fellowship at the Scripps Research Institute in La Jolla, California.

## **Irene and Dr. Arthur M. Fishberg Professor of Medicine**

During their lifetimes, Arthur M. Fishberg, MD, and his wife, Irene, were integral members of the Mount Sinai family. Dr. Fishberg was a distinguished nephrologist and a leading authority on hypertension. His longstanding, devoted professional affiliation with Mount Sinai commenced in 1926 when he began his residency. When Mount Sinai School of Medicine opened in 1963, Dr. Fishberg was appointed Clinical Professor of Medicine and served in this capacity until 1977. For his pioneering spirit, far-reaching professional achievements, and service to the institution, he received the Jacobi Medallion in 1978, The Mount Sinai Alumni Association's most coveted award, and in 1979 was bestowed an honorary Doctor of Science degree from the School of Medicine. Dr. Fishberg also had a passion for research, which he translated into the Irene and Dr. Arthur M. Fishberg Professor of Medicine endowment, established by his estate in 1993. There are currently ten Fishberg Professorships of Medicine at Mount Sinai.

**EIMEAR E. KENNY, PhD**  
**Mount Sinai Professor of Genomic Health**

Eimear E. Kenny, PhD, is the Founding Director of the Institute for Genomic Health and the Center for Translational Genomics, Director of Translational Research in the Division of Genomic Medicine, and Professor of Genetics and Medicine at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai.

Dr. Kenny's work is focused on discovering the genetic causes of disease in globally diverse populations and building resources for integrating genomic information and AI in routine clinical care. She is a strong advocate for the importance of diversity in genomic research and improving the accessibility of genetics to global populations, and her work supports the genetic sequencing and subsequent return of results to patients at Mount Sinai.

Dr. Kenny has led multiple genetics-based clinical trials and serves as Principal Investigator in several large, NIH-funded international consortia focused on computational genomics and genomic medicine, including eMERGE, Polygenic Risk Methods in Diverse Populations, Clinical Sequencing Evidence-Generating Research, the Genome Sequencing Program, Trans-Omics for Precision Medicine, Population Architecture Using Genomics and Epidemiology, and the Human Pangenome Reference Consortium. Her exceptional contributions to the field earned her the prestigious Early Career Award from the American Society of Human Genetics in 2022.

In addition to her academic and research roles, Dr. Kenny serves as a scientific advisor to genomic medicine initiatives in the government, non-profit, and industry sectors. The author of more than 150 papers, she has served on the editorial boards of *Cell Genomics*, the *American Journal of Human Genetics*, *Gigascience*, and *Frontiers in Evolutionary and Population Genetics*.

Dr. Kenny earned her bachelor's degree in biochemistry from Trinity College Dublin and completed her doctoral studies in Computational Genomics at Rockefeller University. Prior to joining Mount Sinai in 2012, she completed her postdoctoral training in Population Genetics at Stanford University, and held positions at the California Institute of Technology and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

**PATTY J. LEE, MD**

**Janice and Coleman Rabin Professorship in Pulmonary Medicine**

Patty J. Lee, MD, is a Professor of Medicine and Pulmonary, Critical Care, and Sleep Medicine at the Icahn School of Medicine. Dr. Lee is an internationally recognized physician-scientist, known for her work in Lung-Vascular Senescence and Obstructive Lung Diseases. Prior to joining Mount Sinai in May 2023, Dr. Lee was Chief of the Pulmonary, Allergy, and Critical Care Division at the Duke University School of Medicine. She also served as Professor of Medicine and Vice Chief of Research, Section of Pulmonary, Critical Care, and Sleep Medicine at the Yale University School of Medicine.

Dr. Lee's research explores oxidant mechanisms and innate immune signaling in lung and endothelial injury, repair and resilience. Her research group has identified novel genes and proteins as key regulators of cytoprotective lung responses to environmental and age-acquired stressors. Her findings have resulted in exciting new collaborations amongst physicians, immunologists, pathologists, and data scientists. In addition, Dr. Lee's research has successfully transitioned from novel molecule discovery to drug discovery efforts, a key step in developing targeted therapies to build tissue resilience.

Throughout her career, Dr. Lee has received awards and honors, including the Sir William Osler Young Investigator Award, the American Lung Association Career Investigator Award, and the American Thoracic Society's Recognition Award for Scientific Accomplishments. She has authored more than 100 peer-reviewed publications, holds six patents, and has mentored more than 45 MD, PhD and MD/PhD trainees, most of whom remain in academic medicine.

Dr. Lee is an elected member of the American Society for Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, the Inter-Urban Clinical Club, the American Society for Clinical Investigation and the Association of American Physicians. She served as Program Chair for the American Thoracic Society, on the Education Committee of the North American Vascular Biology Program, and the Nominating Committee of the Association of Pulmonary, Critical Care, and Sleep Division Directors.

Dr. Lee earned her bachelor and medical degrees from Brown University. She completed the prestigious Osler Medical Residency Program at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, where she remained to undertake fellowship training in pulmonary, critical care, and sleep medicine. She began her career as an Instructor of Medicine at the Yale University School of Medicine.

## **Janice and Coleman Rabin Professorship in Pulmonary Medicine**

The Janice and Coleman Rabin Professorship in Pulmonary Medicine is named for Coleman B. Rabin, MD, one of medicine's great clinician-teacher-investigators, and his wife Janice. The late Dr. and Mrs. Rabin were longtime, cherished members of the Mount Sinai community.

An internationally renowned scholar in pulmonary medicine, Dr. Rabin was the author of numerous landmark papers and books and a mentor to scores of students, residents, and fellows, many of whom have become recognized leaders in the field. Dr. Rabin trained in The Mount Sinai Hospital's house staff program, and went on to serve Mount Sinai with distinction for nearly 70 years, holding appointments in medicine, pathology, radiology, and serving as Director of the Division of Pulmonary Medicine.

In 1961, Dr. Rabin was presented with the Jacobi Medallion—which remains a coveted award for members of the Mount Sinai community—for his great contributions to pulmonary medicine and his extraordinary service and dedication to the institution. True to their enduring devotion and generous support of Mount Sinai, Dr. and Mrs. Rabin established this Chair, as well as a fellowship and visiting lectureship in pulmonary medicine, through their estates.

**SEAN P. PINNEY, MD**  
**Philip J. and Harriet L. Goodhart Professor of Medicine**

Sean J. Pinney, MD, is Professor of Medicine (Cardiology), the Philip J. and Harriet L. Goodhart Professor of Medicine, and Associate Director of the Cardiovascular Clinical Institute at Mount Sinai Morningside.

Dr. Pinney is an active clinical researcher who has led trials in the areas of heart failure, cardiac transplantation, and mechanical circulatory support. He serves on the editorial boards of the *Journal of the American College of Cardiology*, *JACC Heart Failure*, the *Journal of Heart & Lung Transplantation* and the *Journal of Cardiac Failure*. He is on the American Society of Transplantation Board of Directors, is a member of the Georgetown Medical Alumni Board, and is past President of the New York Cardiothoracic Transplant Consortium.

Dr. Pinney first joined the faculty of the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in 2004, where he directed the Advanced Heart Failure and Cardiac Transplant Program. In 2020, he moved to the University of Chicago, where he served as Co-Director of the Heart and Vascular Center, Director of Heart Failure and Transplantation, and Director of Clinical and Translational Research before returning Mount Sinai in 2023.

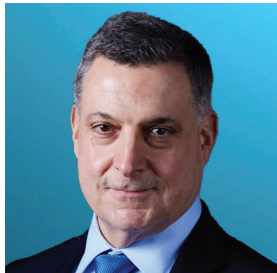
He is the recipient of several awards, including the Pharmacology Research Award from Georgetown University, the Cardiology Fellowship Research Award from Columbia University, the Young Investigator Award from the New York Cardiological Society and the New York Chapter of the American College of Cardiology, and the Simon Dack Award from Mount Sinai. In 2021, he was named a Senior Faculty Scholar at the Bucksbaum Institute for Clinical Excellence at the University of Chicago Medicine.

Dr. Pinney attended Georgetown University, where he received both his undergraduate and medical degrees. He completed his residency training at Boston's Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center and fellowships in cardiology, heart failure, and transplantation at Columbia University.

## Philip J. and Harriet L. Goodhart Professor of Medicine

The Philip J. and Harriet L. Goodhart Professor of Medicine, established in 1969 through the Overbrook Foundation by Mrs. Helen Goodhart Altschul, is named in honor of her philanthropist parents. The late Mr. and Mrs. Goodhart were revered members of the Mount Sinai community, dating back to the early 1900s. Philip J. Goodhart was co-founder of the stockbroking firm P.J. Goodhart & Co. and a member of the New York Stock Exchange for 31 years. He was active in Jewish welfare work for many years, with The Mount Sinai Hospital serving as one of his greatest philanthropic interests. Mr. Goodhart served as a Mount Sinai Trustee from 1907 to 1933, Vice President from 1910-1917, and was an Honorary Trustee from 1933 until his death in 1944. He also served on the Board of Directors of The Mount Sinai Hospital School of Nursing from 1908-1933 and as an Honorary Trustee. His wife, Harriet (Hattie) Lehman Goodhart, shared her husband's commitment to advancing the charitable work of Mount Sinai and other Jewish institutions, serving as a Trustee of the Home for Aged and Infirm Hebrews. The Goodharts made many generous contributions to Mount Sinai, including Mr. Goodhart's dedicated support of Mount Sinai's cardiographic work. They are linked in perpetuity to Mount Sinai programs that bear the Goodhart name, including the Philip J. and Hattie L. Goodhart Endowment Fund and the Philip J. Goodhart Fellowship Fund. Their daughter, the late Mrs. Frank Altschul, sustained her family's distinguished legacy to Mount Sinai and their visionary philanthropy by endowing this Chair and serving as a founding sponsor of Mount Sinai's School of Medicine.

## **CHARLES ANDREW POWELL, MD, MBA** **Florette and Ernst Rosenfeld and Joseph Solomon Professor of Medicine**

Charles Andrew Powell, MD, MBA, is Professor of Medicine and System Division Chief for Pulmonary, Critical Care, and Sleep Medicine at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai.

Dr. Powell's work focuses on the research and treatment of lung nodules and cancer. Dr. Powell is funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH), has published over 150 articles, and directs an NIH-funded translational sciences laboratory that examines the genomics of lung cancer. Dr. Powell's particular area of interest is on deconvoluting the biology and genomics of early stage lung adenocarcinoma, for which recent advances have modified the diagnosis and approach to these tumors. He also directs research programs focused on applications of machine learning and artificial intelligence to advance the diagnosis and treatment of respiratory diseases.

Dr. Powell serves as the CEO of the Mount Sinai Respiratory Institute, which brings together leading expertise in diagnosing and treating all forms of respiratory illness and lung disease, including asthma, lung cancer, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, interstitial lung disease, and bronchiectasis.

Dr. Powell's international reputation in the field is demonstrated by his election as President of the Fleischner Society and by his leadership roles in the International Society of Respiratory Disease. He is chair of the International Multidisciplinary Adjudication Committee to evaluate interstitial lung disease adverse events in cancer clinical trials of antibody-drug conjugates.

Dr. Powell earned his bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Pennsylvania before completing his medical degree at the University of Chicago. He trained in Internal Medicine at Columbia University and in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at Boston University. He also holds an MBA from Yale University.

## **Florette and Ernst Rosenfeld and Joseph Solomon Professor of Medicine**

The Florette and Ernst Rosenfeld and Joseph Solomon Professor of Medicine was established by Ms. Florette R. Stein through her estate in 1975, in honor of her late husband, Ernst Rosenfeld, and her longtime friend and lawyer, Joseph Solomon. In addition to endowing this professorship, Ms. Stein's generous bequest to Mount Sinai has supported a broad range of initiatives, including renovations supporting the Radiology Department and the Klingenstein Pavilion. The bequest also supported research endeavors in gerontology, radiology, speech and hearing, and gout.

## **NEIL M. ROFSKY, MD, MHA**

### **Dr. Charles M. and Marilyn Newman Professor of Radiology**

Neil M. Rofsky, MD, is the Dr. Charles M. and Marilyn Newman Professor of Radiology and Chair of the Department of Diagnostic, Molecular and Interventional Radiology. He is also the Senior Associate Dean of Wellness and Coaching at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai.

Dr. Rofsky's research concentrates on translating innovations in magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) into clinical practice, addressing the theoretical, technical, and practical

challenges to utilizing several complex MRI methods as potential biomarkers for clinical studies. His current studies emphasize developing MRI techniques to improve detection and evaluation of prostate cancer and to better guide treatment.

Prior to joining Mount Sinai in 2023, he was Professor and Chair of University of Texas Southwestern's Department of Radiology and the Effie and Wofford Cain Distinguished Chair in Diagnostic Imaging. Dr. Rofsky also served as Director of Translational Research for the Advanced Imaging Research Center, a collaboration of University of Texas Southwestern and the University of Texas at Dallas. Dr. Rofsky previously held appointments as Chief of MRI at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in Boston, and Professor of Radiology at Harvard Medical School.

Dr. Rofsky served on the Board of Trustees of the Society of Computed Body Tomography and Magnetic Resonance (now known as the Society of Advanced Body Imaging), also serving as president from 2014 to 2015. He has also served on the Board of Trustees of the International Society for Magnetic Resonance in Medicine. Dr. Rofsky has authored more than 200 peer-reviewed publications, several textbooks, and presents regularly at medical societies. In 2019, Dr. Rofsky completed a two-term appointment as Co-Chair for the Clinical Imaging Steering Committee of the National Cancer Institute. In 2023, Dr. Rofsky was awarded a gold medal by the Society for Advanced Body Imaging in recognition of his contributions to the field of advanced body imaging.

Dr. Rofsky received his bachelor's degree in biochemistry from the University of Maryland and his medical degree from New York Medical College.

### **Dr. Charles M. and Marilyn Newman Professor of Radiology**

A renowned neuro-radiologist, Charles M. Newman, MD, served in Mount Sinai's Department of Radiology for three decades. His wife, Marilyn, was a world-famous sculptor who worked with marble and bronze. In 1991, in recognition of Dr. Newman's lifelong connection to Mount Sinai, the Newmans established the Dr. Charles M. and Marilyn Newman Professor of Radiology, the Dr. Charles Newman Scholar-Fellow in Medicine, and an endowed fund to support research activities in the Department of Medicine. These generous gifts bequeathed by the Newmans celebrate Dr. Newman's many years of service at Mount Sinai and his enduring legacy as a researcher, educator, and clinician.



# Biographies: Endowed Professors



**PANAGIOTIS ROUSSOS, MD, PhD**  
**Mount Sinai Professor of Translational Psychiatry**

Panagiotis (Panos) Roussos, MD, PhD, is Professor of Psychiatry, and Genetics and Genomic Sciences, and Director of the Center of Disease Neurogenomics at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai.

Dr. Roussos's research explores the mechanisms through which risk genetic variants increase vulnerability for neuropsychiatric diseases, including schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, and Alzheimer's disease. As the Principal Investigator of multiple grants funded

by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Dr. Roussos is leading efforts aimed at the multi-scale profiling and integrative analysis of neuropsychiatric traits in several consortia.

He has been honored with several awards, including the Eva King Killam Research Award from the American College of Neuropsychopharmacology; the Scientific Award in Life Sciences (Biomedical Sciences) from the Bodossakis Foundation; the Rising Star Award from the Congress of the Schizophrenia International Research Society; and the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers from The White House.

Dr. Roussos completed his Master of Science, his medical degree, and his doctorate in neuroscience at the University of Crete. Dr. Roussos joined Mount Sinai in 2008, where he undertook his residency in psychiatry and completed postdoctoral training in genomics at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, focusing on human brain neurogenomics and molecular and informatics analysis.

## Mount Sinai Professor of Translational Psychiatry

The Mount Sinai Professorships were established in 2007 by the Mount Sinai Boards of Trustees to honor the achievements and contributions of some of the Icahn School of Medicine's most outstanding faculty. As of 2023, a total of 34 faculty will occupy Mount Sinai Professorships in Affective Neuroscience, Allergy and Systems Biology, Alzheimer's Research, Artificial Intelligence, Bioinformatics, Biomedical Data Science, Cancer Biology, Cancer Immunology, Cardiovascular Clinical Research and Outcomes, Cardiovascular Surgery, Cell Biology, Developmental Genetics, Emergency Medicine, Emerging Viruses, Genetic Engineering, Genomic Health, Light and Health Research, Microbiology and Infectious Diseases, Molecular Pharmacology, Multiple Myeloma, Neuroimaging, Neurotherapeutics, Orthopedics, Orthopedic Research, Pediatric Liver Research, Perioperative Care, Predictive Health and Computational Biology, Psychiatric Epigenomics, Psychiatry and Neuroscience of Trauma, Structural Biology, Therapeutics Discovery, Translational Psychiatry, Vaccinology, Vascular Surgery, and Women's Health Research.



# Biographies: Endowed Professors



## **LIOR ZANGI, PhD** **Chan Soon-Shiong Professorship in Cardiovascular Research**

Lior Zangi, PhD, is Associate Professor of Cardiology and Associate Professor of Genetics and Genomic Sciences, with tenure, at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai.

Dr. Zangi completed his Bachelor's degree in Biology and his Master's degree in Experimental and Developmental Medicine at Hebrew University in Israel before earning his PhD in Immunology at the Weizmann Institute of Science. He completed postdoctoral fellowships in stem cell biology, mRNA therapeutics, and cardiac regeneration at Tel Aviv University, Harvard University, and Harvard Medical School, where he was promoted to an Instructor position.

Dr. Zangi's research focuses on methods for delivering modified mRNA (modRNA) to the heart to induce cardiac and cardiovascular regeneration and protection following ischemic injury. Indeed, Dr. Zangi's published work was the first to demonstrate modRNA delivery into cardiac and skeletal muscle and pioneered the use of modRNA to treat ischemic heart disease. His publications showed, for the first time, that modRNA technology can generate cardiac repair after heart attack and prevent heart failure formation, in both small and large animal preclinical models.

Throughout his studies, Dr. Zangi's innovative work laid the foundation for four biotech startup companies and led to eleven modRNA-based patent applications and two awarded patents. The two awarded patents led to the first phase II cardiac modRNA therapeutic clinical trial and the establishment of a novel modRNA-based method for minimally invasive gene delivery into specific cell types and organs to fight conditions such as heart failure, cardiotoxicity, and cancer.

Dr. Zangi is a founding board member and Treasurer of the Society for RNA Therapeutics and currently serves as Scientific Director of the PSMC5 Foundation and a founding board member of the American Friends of ALUT. He has been honored with several awards, including the American Heart Association Postdoctoral Fellowship Award, and was Co-Winner of the Mount Sinai Faculty Idea Prize, SINAIInnovations.

## **Chan Soon-Shiong Professorship in Cardiovascular Research**

The Chan Soon-Shiong Professorship in Cardiovascular Research was established by Dr. Patrick Soon-Shiong and his wife, Michele B. Chan Soon-Shiong, via the Chan Soon-Shiong Family Foundation.

Dr. Soon-Shiong is a scientist, transplant surgeon, and inventor of the nanoparticle chemotherapeutic agent, Abraxane. Mrs. Chan Soon-Shiong is the founder and president of NantStudios, a virtual production company, and a passionate advocate for access to health care for all. Through the Chan Soon-Shiong Family Foundation, Dr. Soon-Shiong and Mrs. Chan Soon-Shiong have pledged \$1 billion to support the transformation of health care in the United States and around the world. The Foundation is working to eliminate disparities in health care and help bring about a system that aims to keep people healthy and ensures that everybody has access to the best quality of health care when they need it.

In addition to the Chan Soon-Shiong Professorship, Dr. Soon-Shiong and Mrs. Chan Soon-Shiong have generously supported a number of programs at Mount Sinai, including the Cardiovascular Research Institute and COVID-19 research.
